

# LOCATION

## ACCESS TO REGIONAL AND GLOBAL MARKETS


Situated in the southeast portion of Greater Phoenix, Chandler is easily accessible by several major freeways including Interstate 10, the southernmost coast-to-coast interstate highway in the United States, as well as the US 60 Superstition Freeway, Loop 202 San Tan Freeway and Loop 101 Price Freeway.

A number of major regional markets are located within a day's drive including Los Angeles, San Diego, Las Vegas, Salt Lake City, Albuquerque, Denver and El Paso.



Rail service is provided through two single-track freight spur lines. Owned and operated by the Union Pacific Railroad, these lines offer connections to markets throughout North America.

With Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport a short 20 minutes away, no location is truly out of reach. Phoenix-Mesa Gateway Airport is nearby and offers an alternative for cargo shipments and limited passenger service.






# HIGHER EDUCATION

## NEARBY COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES SUPPLY YOUNG, TALENTED GRADUATES

Greater Phoenix is home to a myriad of top-notch colleges, universities and specialized institutions committed to providing a trained workforce to support 21st century jobs, including:

- Arizona State University, the largest public university by enrollment in the United States. ASU has more than 91,000 students across five Greater Phoenix campuses, four regional learning centers throughout Arizona and its ASU Online programs. In Downtown Chandler, ASU has established its Chandler Innovation Center where it hosts workshops, events, and provides engineering and technology-based education.
- The University of Arizona, which has a total enrollment of more than 43,000 students. UA's main campus is in Tucson but the university has an expanding presence in Greater Phoenix, which includes its UA College of Medicine-Phoenix campus and Eller MBA programs in downtown Phoenix, and its Master of Education Program in Downtown Chandler.
- Maricopa Community Colleges, one of the nation's largest community college districts, serving more than 265,000 students annually. The countywide district has 10 colleges including Chandler-Gilbert Community College in Chandler.


### Enrollment





### Instate Tuition (2016-17)

# K-12 EDUCATION

HOME TO SOME OF THE HIGHEST RATED SCHOOLS IN ARIZONA

Parents trust Chandler schools to provide students with the knowledge and skills to become lifelong learners and responsible citizens. Five public school districts provide service to our residents, with Chandler Unified School District and Kyrene School District serving the majority of the City. These schools, along with a number of private and charter schools, are among Arizona's highest rated with standardized test scores well above state and national averages.

Excellence in Chandler K-12 programs can be seen in:

-  Championship academic, fine arts and athletics programs
-  Self-contained gifted programs, beginning in kindergarten
-  College preparatory advanced placement instruction
-  Accelerated International Baccalaureate Study
-  Career and technical education
-  Medical professions field of study
-  Science and biotech classes promoting emerging tech fields



## Chandler Unified School District

Chandler Unified School District (CUSD) serves more than 41,000 students in grades K-12 and consists of 29 elementary schools, seven junior highs, five high schools and three alternative schools. Academic success is a high priority in the district as evidenced by students consistently scoring among the top in the state on college-entrance exams. Because of the outstanding educational programs offered, almost all of the district schools have been cited for excellence by outside organizations, such as the Arizona Department of Education and the U.S. Department of Education.


Additional CUSD accolades and achievements include:

-  Being named the number one public K-12 district in Arizona two years in a row by Niche.com
-  The 2016 graduating class earning more than \$118 million in scholarship offers
-  Chandler Unified schools being named Arizona A+ Schools of Excellence or U.S. Blue Ribbon Schools of Excellence 73 times since 1983, the most of any district in Arizona
-  Continued domination of the Arizona Science and Engineering Fair (AzSEF). In 2016, Chandler Unified schools won Best of Fair for both Elementary and Senior High divisions. Ten out of the 15 Grand Award-winning students from Arizona to proceed to the Intel International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) hailed from CUSD. Of the 10 projects sent, CUSD students brought home more than a dozen awards from ISEF including two Grand Awards.

## Kyrene School District

Kyrene Elementary School District is an “A” rated district comprised of 25 schools serving students in grades K-8. The District’s boundaries encompass all of Ahwatukee and parts of Chandler, Guadalupe, Tempe and the Gila River Indian Community. In Chandler, Kyrene operates five elementary schools and two junior highs. Three of the elementary schools and both junior highs have been named Arizona A+ Schools of Excellence by the Arizona Educational Foundation.

Kyrene schools offer an innovative learning environment with technology enhanced curriculum. Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) subjects are an integral part of daily lesson plans and also are incorporated into after school programs. One of Kyrene’s Chandler elementary schools is even home to a “DISCOVERoom,” an interactive STEM activity room offered as an alternative to recess on the playground and as a resource for teaching science. Excellence in STEM education also can be seen at the junior high level. In 2015, a team from one of Kyrene’s Chandler junior highs won Best in Nation in the Verizon Innovative Learning app challenge, a nationwide contest to develop concepts for mobile apps that solve real world problems.

## Pro-business Local Government

The actions of our pro-business local government have cultivated a place for progress. City leadership's aggressive pursuit of timely capital improvement projects has helped Chandler become one of the best-equipped cities for business.



## Infrastructure

Chandler's experience with nationally recognized companies has enhanced our capacity to support the needs of many industries, particularly the high-tech, manufacturing and financial services sectors. This includes ensuring the City has the necessary infrastructure for future growth in these areas. Chandler's infrastructure includes:

- An extensive, ultra-pure nitrogen pipeline
- Robust high-speed and wireless telecom network
- Advanced water-recycling methods
- Redundant water system to deliver under any conditions
- High-capacity utilities
- Municipal airport with parallel runways and heliport



## Progressive Water Management

Chandler has long been a pioneer in advanced water management. The City has planned and managed water supplies to meet projected demands for build-out. Robust water resources and advanced underground water storage infrastructure ensure that all commercial and industrial water needs are met.

## Utility Rates

The City of Chandler provides high quality water and sewer service at some of the lowest rates in the region. Rates are based on a monthly base charge and monthly volume charge.

Salt River Project (SRP) and Arizona Public Service (APS) provide electricity service to Chandler with price plans for large and small users, including time-of-use plans to maximize savings.

## Business Incubation

Chandler supports early stage companies by maintaining a City-funded business incubator called “Innovations” that offers incubation programming and services delivered by NACET. Designed to create a culture of startup support throughout the community, these offerings are available to resident clients as well as affiliate clients based outside of the incubator facility.

No matter where a startup is in its development, Innovations offers resources to help accelerate it to the next phase. Services include one-on-one business coaching, hands-on workshops, and a support network of mentors and technical advisors that can help guide startups throughout the entrepreneurial journey, from business idea to scaling for growth.



## Coworking

Chandler is home to Gangplank, a collaborative coworking and event space in Downtown Chandler, that provides free coworking space and opportunities for networking, professional development and mentoring. People who frequent the space include engineers, software developers, photographers, videographers, painters, illustrators and artists of all kinds.



## Makerspace

Chandler is also home to TechShop, a community-based workshop and prototyping studio that provides access to the tools, equipment, education and other resources entrepreneurs need to develop their ideas and turn them into reality. TechShop is housed in the ASU Chandler Innovation Center, an engineering and technology-based education and research hub located in Downtown Chandler.



# MUNICIPAL AIRPORT



OPERATING ONE OF THE BUSIEST GENERAL AVIATION AIRPORTS IN THE COUNTRY



## Overview

Chandler Municipal Airport is located just 20 minutes southeast of Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport, making it a convenient alternative for business and recreational aircraft.

Take advantage of quick, easy access to anywhere in Greater Phoenix, including some of Arizona's largest employers, spas, golf courses, shopping centers, hotels, resorts and casinos. If your destination is Chandler, Gilbert, Mesa, Queen Creek, Scottsdale or Tempe, add Chandler Municipal to your flight plan.

Outstanding year-round flying conditions and an average of more than 350 Visual Flight Rules days draw students and aviation enthusiasts from around the world. Chandler Municipal is ideal for business flights, charter, sightseeing, public safety, air support and humanitarian missions.

Last year, Chandler Municipal Airport experienced more than 200,000 take offs and landings, making it one of the busiest general aviation airports in the United States.

# PUBLIC SAFETY

DEDICATED TO ENSURING A SAFE COMMUNITY FOR OUR CITIZENS



## Chandler Police Department

The Chandler Police Department (CPD) is committed to being a world-class leader in law enforcement. CPD employs more than 320 sworn officers and 150 civilians. There are three precincts to meet the needs of the community: Main Station, Desert Breeze and Chandler Heights.

Since 1996, the Chandler Police Department has been accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) with re-accreditation occurring every three years. In 2014, CALEA awarded CPD the prestigious Gold Standard Assessment with Excellence, becoming the first police agency in the state to receive such an honor.

The City of Chandler has experienced historically low crime rates over the years. In 2015, Part I Crimes (those considered to be most serious) were recorded at their lowest level since 1988 when the City's population was only 83,000 people.

The Chandler Police Department offers several free programs to the local business community to help combat crime including Business Security Checks, Robbery Prevention and Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design.

# PUBLIC SAFETY

CAPABLE OF RESPONDING QUICKLY TO ANY EMERGENCY CALL

## Chandler Fire, Health & Medical Department

Chandler Fire, Health & Medical Department (CFHM) is an all-hazards agency that maintains 10 fire stations with more than 200 sworn firefighters. All station personnel are certified emergency medical technicians and most are paramedics.

Since 1998, the Chandler Fire, Health & Medical Department has been accredited by the Commission on Fire Accreditation International. Only 10 other departments in the nation had been accredited when CFHM first achieved this designation and only a handful have been re-accredited four times.

CFHM responded to 23,440 emergency calls during 2015 at an average response time of 3:57. The department has been awarded an ISO Class 3 rating, signifying it has an excellent fire-suppression program. Only about 10 percent of departments nationwide have a Class 3 or lower rating. The insurance industry uses these ISO classifications when setting insurance rates in communities.

Several inspection programs help local businesses maintain a safe work environment including annual inspection, HazMat inspection, new business inspection and self-inspection for qualified small businesses.

### Executive Luxury


